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RESUMEN

En el presente artículo, profundizaré en el neoexistencialismo contemporáneo en la teoría educativa, explorando las razones que han recomendado el redescubrimiento de una postura existencialista en nuestra época, el significado de estos esfuerzos para las iniciativas contemporáneas, así como la forma en que se ha concretado el impulso existencialista. En particular, tras situar el neoexistencialismo actual en el contexto del existencialismo educativo de mediados del siglo XX y tras precisar su actualidad como respuesta al dominio neoliberal sobre la educación, me centraré en dos modelos: la esubjetivación y el esprendizaje existenciale; y mostraré que en última instancia representan dos opciones pedagógicas alternativas.
