Tague, 2002 An examination of the interaction between ideology and experience in the lives of English women during a period of great social and intellectual change Focusing on the complex relationship between discourse and experience *Women of Quality* examines the role of gender in aristocratic women's daily lives during a period of significant cultural change In the years following the Glorious Revolution didactic writers and other social critics responded to a perceived crisis of gender relations by creating a new discourse of natural feminine behavior in opposition to the luxury and decadence of fashionable women Modern scholars have often portrayed this agenda as representing the rise of a middle class ideology but Ingrid Tague argues that the new rhetoric held enormous appeal for those women who would appear to be its greatest targets wealthy fashionable women of quality Using the correspondence and diaries of these women Tague traces the ways in which they adopted adapted and exploited ideals of femininity In their hands feminine values could become powerful tools that enabled them to compete for status and reputation Ironically by identifying femininity with private trivial concerns these ideals created unique opportunities for elite women Female participation in informal social and political activities placed women at the heart of aristocratic power in the early eighteenth century even as they employed the language of wifely subordination and domesticity Ingrid Tague is Assistant Professor of History at the University of Denver *Deserted Wives and Economic Divorce in 19th-Century England and Wales* Jennifer Aston, Olive Anderson, 2024-11-14 This book considers Section 21 of the Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act 1857 and its significant impact on previously invisible married women in the 19th century Tens of thousands of women used this little known section of the Act to apply for orders from local magistrates courts to reclaim their rights of testation inheritance property ownership and dependent on local franchise qualifications ability to vote By examining the orders that were made and considering the women who applied for them the book challenges the mistaken belief that Victorian England and Wales were nations of married cohabiting couples The detailed statistical analysis and rich case studies presented here provide a totally new perspective on the legal status and experiences of married women in England and Wales Although many thousands of orders were granted between 1858 and 1900 their details remain unknown and unexamined primarily because census records did not consistently record dissolved marriages and there is no central index of applications made Using sources including court records parliamentary papers newspaper reports census returns probate records and trade directories this book reconstructs the successful and unsuccessful experiences of women applying to magistrates courts and the Court for Divorce and Matrimonial Causes to protect their assets across regions and decades *Love, Lust, and License*

in *Early Modern England* Johanna Rickman, 2016-12-05 Focusing on cases of extramarital sex Johanna Rickman investigates fornication adultery and bastard bearing among the English nobility during the Elizabethan and early Stuart period Since members of the nobility were not generally brought before the ecclesiastical courts which had jurisdiction over other citizens sexual offences Rickman's sources include collections of family papers primarily letters state papers and literary texts prescriptive manuals love sonnets satirical verse and prose romances as well as legal documents Rickman explores how attitudes towards illicit sex varied greatly throughout the period of study roughly 1560-1630 While some viewed it as a minor infraction others directed by a religious moral code viewed it as a serious sin seeks to illuminate the place of noblewomen in early modern aristocratic culture both as historical subjects considering personal circumstances and as a social group considering social position and status She argues that two different gender ideals were in operation simultaneously one primarily religious ideal which lauded female silence obedience and chastity and another more secular ideal which required noblewomen to be beautiful witty brave and receptive to the games of courtly love

BOOK JACKET Title Summary field provided by Blackwell North America Inc All Rights Reserved *Dr Johnson's Friend and Robert Adam's Client Topham Beauclerk* David Noy,2016-05-11 Dr Johnson said that he would walk to the ends of the earth to save Beauclerk Other people who claimed to be his friends rejoiced at his early death How did the beautiful youth of Francis Coates 1756 portrait become a man whose greatest claim to fame was causing an infestation of lice at Blenheim Palace through lack of personal hygiene A great grandson of Charles II and Nell Gwyn he lived a privileged life thanks to fortuitously inherited wealth He employed Robert Adam to build him a house at Muswell Hill which has almost completely disappeared from the records of Adam s work due to a dispute about the bill He was one of the leading book collectors of the time with a library of 30 000 volumes whose sale after his death was a major literary event He also used his wealth to indulge interests in science and astronomy and a passion for gambling As a result he ran through his inheritance as quickly as he could sell it falling into ever increasing debt as his lawyer grew richer Beauclerk knew all the leading figures of the British and French Enlightenments He was a friend of Johnson Adam Smith David Hume Horace Walpole Sir Joshua Reynolds John Wilkes and David Garrick He met Rousseau and Voltaire and immersed himself in French salon culture He could charm people when he chose to but did not always try Recently he has been overshadowed by his wife Lady Di n e Spencer whose life by Carola Hicks *Improper Pursuits* 2001 has made her artistic talent and unconventional life well known The story of their adultery and marriage has not previously been told from Beauclerk s point of view and many other inaccuracies have crept into authoritative works such as the ODNB he is regularly and unfairly dismissed as a bad husband This biography shows that he was much more than the close associate of Johnson known from the pages of Boswell a man of widely varied interests from the Grand Tour to the contemporary theatre who lived Enlightenment life to the full in a way which would not have been possible a generation earlier or later Based on research in unpublished letters legal documents and financial records including some concerning the Adam house as well as published diaries letters and memoirs it shows that he may have left no enduring legacy of his many talents as even his friends admitted but he made the most of all the opportunities available and lived a fascinating life which illuminates every aspect of Georgian elite society from auctions to zoology from care of one s wig to building an observatory and from mishaps in Venice to sea therapy in Brighton
