

The print trade asserted its authority using a rhetoric of hierarchical and binary sexuality and gender which affected women working in the industry and limited the type of work they were allowed to perform In response women developed strategies to redeploy conventional ideas of gender to gain concessions for themselves as publishers and distributors of printed material strategies that formed a foundation for the rise of female authorship later in the eighteenth century Encompassing the histories of literature labor technology publishing and gender The Work of Print ultimately offers significant insights into the ideology of authorship and intellectual property and our understanding of textuality and print in the digital age
